Pastor Carlin's Page

This month we look at the "*Six Marks of Discipleship.*" The third mark is that of continued and daily Bible reading. This is one discipline that one would think would be easy to achieve, but according to statistics the contrary is the norm. Pastor Michael Foss has gathered what he calls "sobering statistics" about Bible reading in the United Sates.

- 91 percent of households in the United States own a at least one Bible.
- The typical household owns three Bibles.
- 38 percent of adults in the U.S. read the Bible during a typical week-not including when they are at church.
- Among Bible readers, the average amount of time spent reading the Bible during an entire week is fifty-two minutes-or, about ten minutes a day.

According to the statistics the Bible is readily accessible to most people in this country, however, it appears most Americans do not make themselves readily accessible to the Bibles they possess. This in and of itself is a travesty. Beyond this, the biblical IQ of most people including Christians is abhorrent. Generalities and platitudes have taken the place of thoughtful and diligent study of God's word. Unfortunately, both laity and clergy have normalized issues, sayings and theologies that have supposedly come through the Bible, but are nowhere to be found among its pages. One example of this is the adage "Cleanliness is next to Godliness." This phrase is not found within the pages of Holy Scripture, but alas, many folks believe it is found in the Bible. This may be harmless, however, other issues that have become "normal theology" may not be as benign. Scripture itself warns us to not add or take away from its message or words. "¹⁸I warn everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: if anyone adds to them, God will add to that person the plagues described in this book;" (Revelation 22:18. NRSV). These are only some of the dangers of failing to read the Bible on a continued and daily basis.

If we fail to read God's word we not only have a low biblical IQ and miss its true message, but we deny ourselves of one of the greatest tools for living God has given to humanity. God's word stands as an oasis in the desert of life and fills us with its life giving message of hope and love that the Holy Spirit uses to reenergize us for all that life holds. Every time we open the Bible and consume the Good news of Christ it strengthens us and helps us to mature into true disciples of Jesus Christ. When this happens we are energized and equipped to fulfill "The Great Commission of Christ," " ¹⁸And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with vou always, to the end of the age."(Matthew 28:18-20), which is the true purpose of the Church.

Becoming true Disciples of Christ requires much work and is very costly; however, Christ as Matthew 28 spells out desires disciples and not just people who call themselves church members to do his work. A



person can be a member of anything, but only true disciples are members of the true and mystical "Body of Christ."


