Oh How We Have Fallen

Like many of you, I was shocked 3 years ago by the fire that destroyed much of Notre Dame Cathedral. Though, I have never visited and seen it's splendor nor traversed its hallowed halls, nonetheless, I was mesmerized by this magnificent edifice. My bucket list included a tour of the Cathedral if circumstances would allow.

The international outpouring of grief was swift and overwhelming. News reports kept pouring in from the scene. And with the toppling of the famous spire many hearts around the world fell as well.

Soon the mourning would begin as Facebook and other social media sites began to swell with thoughts, pictures and memories of many who had stepped through the ancient passages and many who like me dreamed of doing so.

As I watched the famed structure give way to the onslaught and destructive force of the blaze within its hallowed walls, I was hit like a brick by an utterly disturbing and fascinating thought.

The fire devastating Notre Dame Cathedral and bringing it to its proverbial knees is strikingly similar to what is happing to the very faith the Cathedral was supposed to represent.

Again, I detest the tragic event that brought down this historic and revered building. I would like to see it rebuilt, however, it can never be what it was before the fire. Though, when the rubber meets the road what in reality is everyone so worked up about, a building? Yes it may have been revered, it may have been historic and it may even have been iconic but it is just a building.

It seems as if many of the folks in the world are worked up about this event, yet all buildings will fall at some point. Jesus speaking of the coming destruction of Jerusalem says this about the Temple in Mark 13: "And as he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher, what wonderful stones and what wonderful buildings!"² And Jesus said to him, "Do you see these great buildings? There will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down." (ESV)

Jesus is pointing us beyond what we deem as important and seeks to remove the blinders from our eyes to see what is truly important. It is sad the Notre Dame Cathedral was burned. Yet while we focus on a fallen building a lot of suffering and anguish is going unnoticed. Perhaps the greatest loss is that of Christian virtue.

With all eyes on a building very few have seen the ever creeping decline of Christianity and the teachings of Christ. While we watch a very famous building fall and grieve over it, love, forgiveness, joy longsuffering, peace, contentment and much more that can be found as a follower of Jesus Christ have given way to us fulfilling this scripture, "You blind guides, straining out a gnat and swallowing a camel!" (Matthew 23: 24 ESV) We often become blind to the realities of Christ and fall headfirst into the phony-reality of this world.

A great building has fallen; it stands as an allegory of what has fallen within the hearts of God's people. We are so often mesmerized by the shiny object within our gaze and fail to see the greater truths God has for us.



May at Noah's Ark

We had a WONDERFUL turnout at Pre-Registration (we already have over 50 kids enrolled!) and are so excited for our enrollment for this next school year! We still have room for more students, so please tell your family and friends and we will be holding Registration on Tuesday, August 16th from 11-1 and 4-6.

We also offer the option of your 3 year old being enrolled the month AFTER they turn 3! We are so excited to have added this option to our classroom environment! Previously a child had to turn 3 before September 1st to be enrolled for that year.

The 3-year-old classes are held on Tuesday and Thursday from 8:15-10:15 and 10:30-12:30. The 4-year-old classes are held on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:15-11:15 and 11:45-2:45.

The 3-year-old classroom has been working hard to master the letters in their name before summer! They have enjoyed doing St. Patrick's Day activities, and have begun incorporating spring activities before summer break! They also have been working hard on their songs for Spring Concert.

Our 4 year olds have been working hard on learning their last names and focusing more on their lowercase letters in preparation for Kindergarten! They also enjoyed doing lots of St. Patrick's Day activities and playing with Lucky Charm marshmallows in our sensory bin. This week we are transitioning into Spring activities before we end for summer and our friends have a paper chain with the number of days we have left in class! They have worked very hard on the songs that they will perform for their parents at Graduation!

We have continued working on our Calendar binders, inside they trace the number for the day (which is our date), and they chart what our weather is outside that day! This helps them see data and which has more (sunny, cloudy, rainy, snowy or windy).

We also talk about our emotions with our emoji dice during circle time at the end of the day. This helps our friends learn that it is okay to share when they have big feelings and that it is OKAY to have lots of emotions. We should talk about them with adults if we need to and they can help us, or give hugs if they want one. So often children are told to "stop crying", or children's feelings aren't validated because it isn't convenient but we feel as though we need to communicate to children that "big" feelings are okay (as long as we are not acting out, hitting and kicking) and teach them how to regulate these emotions correctly!

Our primary goal is still to ensure the safety of our students; parents and teachers while at the same time promote a **positive and fun** preschool experience.



Please prayerfully consider joining us as we begin to plan our event for this year.


