On March 4th 1933 at his first inaugural speech President Franklin D. Roosevelt made what has become one of the most famous statements of all time. Mr. Roosevelt exclaimed "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself." President Roosevelt made this statement at arguably one of the lowest points in the history of the United States at the height of The Great Depression. The country as a whole was mired with mass unemployment, food rationing, a stagnate economy and little hope on the horizon. The threat of starvation was a daily reality for millions; and the promise of the Promised Land called America seemed totally lost for many.

The circumstances of The Great Depression brought about and fostered an atmosphere of unmitigated fear; and President Roosevelt sought to quell the nation's fears with his now famous speech.

In much the same manner, God quells our fear. All one needs to do is look up the word fear in a concordance and they will find that the most voiced command in all of scripture is "Fear not." Fear is a paralyzing emotion that limits our ability in all facets of life. The fear of dying or harm often keeps us from truly living. Fear of loss and failure keeps many from starting a dream business, going to college, reaching their potential, or even from asking out that special someone. These are but a few examples of the destructive and hindering power of fear. However, one fear may trump all others. This would be fear of learning the truth.

Yes, often times we are hindered, harmed and many have even been destroyed for fear of learning the truth. It is a very hard thing to come to grips with our own self- imposed limits we have placed on digging deeper into the mysteries of God. Most of us are afraid to step outside the boundaries of our theological comfort zone. To do so could bring all we have based our world around crashing down on us; literally pulling the rug out from under the neat little religious box we have attempted to confine the creator of the universe known as God into. Confining God to our standards and limited understanding puts God in our control; and who is really in charge in our lives when we do this? In my humble opinion, when we do this we are breaking the first commandment (I am the Lord your God. You shall have no other gods).

For many Christians it is easier to lie to themselves and pretend they have the unlimited God, (in every facet), figured out, than it is to admit that in reality none of us has even fathomed the tip of the proverbial iceberg that is our almighty God and Father. The Apostle Paul gave this advice to a young preacher named Timothy, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." Words that should bring fear to all who fail to heed them, but unending joy and abundant life to all who do.



Mission/Social Committee Project: LWR School Kits

Impossible to believe, but it is once again time to think of collecting supplies for school kits that are distributed to needy children throughout the world. We will run the collection from mid-July through September. Again, there will be bins placed at the entrances to the church. I will also run off extra sheets near the bins, so feel free to take on for when you are shopping.

Items needed for the School Kits:

- * 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper 8" x 10 ½" (NO loose-leaf paper)
- * 30 centimeter rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- * Pencil sharpeners
- * Blunt end scissors (**NO** pointed ends)
- * Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- * Black or blue ballpoint pens (**NO** gel ink)
- * Boxes of 16 or 24 crayons (**ONLY** sizes)
- * 2 ½ inch erasers

NOTE: LWR <u>cannot</u> accept any supplies other than those on the list. We ended last year with an abundance of pencils that will carry over to this year. We are usually mostly in need of the spiral notebooks, as <u>FOUR</u> of them go in each kit. Please make sure they are the 70-sheet, 8 x 10½ spiral notebooks. They are often sold for 15-25 cents during the back-to-school sales during July & August.

Last year we delivered 98 school kits for distribution! Hopefully, we can do as well this year. Thank you to First Lutheran for your support and generosity.

The grocery carts are located in the fellowship hall & by the ramp door, and I check them weekly to make deliveries to assist in feeding our community members. 
