Pastor Carlin's Page

Recently, I was rereading a classic Christian book by Dietrich Bonhoeffer called "Life Together." I had forgotten some of the sound advice he gives Christians on living in community. I was struck by the advice he gives to anyone who may have ill or bad thoughts or feelings toward another. I will not quote him verbatim; however, the just of his argument was that if we are harboring ill or bad feelings toward someone else to pray for them. He is quick to remind us that they may not change the thing or behavior we find annoying; though, as he says it is difficult to be mad at someone or hold something against them if we pray for them.

Certainly, this is true. Often, the change needed in any situation is not by the other or having them removed from the equation as many often seek; in essence it is us who needs to change. Seldom do we consider our actions and look inward for the answer. Most of the time we feel the solution to our ills and problems rests outside ourselves. This sometimes may be the case but more often than not the answer lies squarely on and in us. Bonhoeffer's theory is not original, Jesus made the case for this type of juxtaposition himself in "The Sermon on the Mount:" (Matthew 5:43-48)

Love Your Enemies

⁴³ "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' ⁴⁴ But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. ⁴⁶ For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your brothers,^[b] what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? ⁴⁸ You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

For when we pray for another, we are reminded of God's grace and mercy to us. And if he applies this grace and mercy to us then we can most certainly apply it to others. For just like the one who we harbor ill will towards we have been redeemed by Jesus sacrifice. Therefore, we are joined with them by Christ, In Him, With Him, Through Him. We cannot change others and many times they never change to our satisfaction, however, as we begin to look at the situation through the eyes of Christ we become changed and renewed in Jesus.

Grace and peace to each of you from Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord!!



## Mission/Social Committee Project: LWR School Kits

Impossible to believe, but it is once again time to think of collecting supplies for school kits that are distributed to needy children throughout the world. We will run the collection from mid-July through September. Again, there will be bins placed at the entrances to the church. I will also run off extra sheets near the bins, so feel free to take on for when you are shopping.

Items needed for the School Kits:

- \* 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper 8" x 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (<u>NO</u> loose-leaf paper)
- \* 30 centimeter rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- \* Pencil sharpeners
- \* Blunt end scissors (<u>NO</u> pointed ends)
- \* Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- \* Black or blue ballpoint pens (<u>NO</u> gel ink)
- \* Boxes of 16 or 24 crayons (**ONLY** sizes)
- \*  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch erasers

**NOTE**: LWR <u>cannot</u> accept any supplies other than those on the list. We ended last year with an abundance of pencils that will carry over to this year. We are usually mostly in need of the spiral notebooks, as <u>FOUR</u> of them go in each kit. Please make sure they are the 70-sheet,  $8 \times 10\frac{1}{2}$  spiral notebooks. They are often sold for 15-25 cents during the back-to-school sales during July & August.

Last year we delivered 98 school kits for distribution! Hopefully, we can do as well this year. Thank you to First Lutheran for your support and generosity.

The grocery carts are located in the fellowship hall & by the ramp door, and I check them weekly to make deliveries to assist in feeding our community members.
