# **Stewardship Pledge**

It is asked that everyone fill out their monetary and service (Time and Talents) gifts that they intend to give unto God in the upcoming year on a piece of paper. Then put this pledge into a sealed self-addressed stamped envelope and place it into a box that will be placed in the church during October. This year we will ask God to bless our promises of time talent and finance to His kingdom and we will mail them right back to each of you unopened. We will pray and bless our promises at our November 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> 2022 services. Only you and God will know of your pledge of your time, talents and money. We then ask that you place your pledge paper in a conspicuous place in your home as a reminder of your gift and promise to God. It is then up to you to uphold your pledge before the Almighty to whom you have made a promise. The God who knows all will know if we keep our promises and if we serve Him as true followers of His Son Jesus Christ.

Some things it is hoped folks will commit to accomplish in this upcoming year are listed below.

1. Make weekly church attendance a priority. Also, seek to avail yourself of other activities such as Bible study and Sunministries.

- 4. Pray each day for the ministries and staff of FLC.
- 5. Read God's word daily and find a solid devotion to follow.
- 6. Invite folks to attend services at FLC.
- 7. Share the Gospel with others in your community. Also, share FLC posts on social media, these are both vital means of evangelization.
- 8. Consider the change stewardship chart and give over your normal giving.

**10:30:** Do you think a time change would be better for this service, either moving up to 11:00 or moving to Sunday evening (4:00-7:00)?


Should we continue this service as a blended or contemporary service?

Thinking of you

Impossible to believe, but it is once again time to think of collecting supplies for school kits that are distributed to needy children throughout the world. We will run the collection from mid-July through September. Again, there will be bins placed at the entrances to the church. I will also run off extra sheets near the bins, so feel free to take on for when you are shopping.

Items needed for the School Kits:

- \* 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper 8" x 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (<u>NO</u> loose-leaf paper)
- \* 30 centimeter rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- \* Pencil sharpeners
- \* Blunt end scissors (<u>NO</u> pointed ends)
- \* Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- \* Black or blue ballpoint pens (<u>NO</u> gel ink)
- \* Boxes of 16 or 24 crayons (**ONLY** sizes)
- \*  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch erasers

**NOTE**: LWR <u>cannot</u> accept any supplies other than those on the list. We ended last year with an abundance of pencils that will carry over to this year. We are usually mostly in need of the spiral notebooks, as <u>FOUR</u> of them go in each kit. Please make sure they are the 70-sheet,  $8 \times 10^{1/2}$  spiral notebooks. They are often sold for 15-25 cents during the back-to-

Livingston Area Food Pantry during the coronavirus pandemic. The pantry has remained open with limited hours and drive-through pick ups to ensure the safety of the workers and clients. The mission and social committee continues to monetarily support the pantry, especially during these difficult times when so many are unemployed and money is tight. During the month of **September** we will collect (especially personals) **laundry soap**, **dish soap**, **bar soap**, **female hygiene products (sanitary napkins & tampons)**, **toilet paper**, **facial tissues**, **paper towels**, **COMPLETE pancake mix**, **& syrup**. And, as always, <u>any</u> food or "non-essential" item is appreciated. <u>All donated</u> items should be <u>NON-PERISHABLE & NOT</u> <u>OUTDATED</u>, please.

I realize the list is long. Please feel free to choose as few or as many items as you wish. Moreover, the pantry encourages us to purchase items inexpensively at Dollar Tree and Dollar General.

The church is open daily (M-F) from 8:00 am-3:30 pm. The grocery carts are located in the fellowship hall & by the ramp door, and I check them weekly to make deliveries to assist in feeding our community members.
