The Highest Office

On February 14th of 2018 a horrific shooting took place in Parkland Florida at Marjorie Stoneman Douglas High School. Unfortunately, seventeen students and faculty members were killed and many others injured. On that day, I found out about the shooting on my way to pick-up my high schooler. As I heard the reports on my car radio my heart began to sink. My thoughts went to my son as well as the other children at Organ Church, were I served at the time, who attended various schools within Rowan County. These schools are not any different from the one in Florida. This truly hit home for me and many throughout our nation. As usual at events like these emotions run high and discussions ensue about ways to end this sort of senseless violence from happening again.

Since this tragic day, I have heard a plethora of things many folks think will help. Most of these folks, I think are well meaning and have the best of intentions. I do not think this of the political class weighing in on the issue as both sides seek only a political advantage over the other. I have a very jaded view of politicians and feel they care little about the folks affected and are more interested in the talking point and issue to use for advantage. However, as much discussion as has taken place and it should, I have not heard anyone discuss what I consider the root cause of this and all other similar events. I believe the weak state of the family is the reason behind these events and most of the decline in our society.

The main reason the issue of the family is not mentioned is because it is not political and will not get clicks on social media or bring in viewers or readers to TV or print media. In other words, politicians and TV talking heads find little or no benefit in discussing this most pressing issue. Also, the thought of marriage and family has become passé and is thought to be a relic from our past that has outlasted its relevance. However, if one just delves briefly into statistical data from the past several decades we can see a direct correlation between social decline, violence, drug abuse, murder, as well as declines in adult behavior, student behavior and success in school and beyond. All this and more can be attributed to a decline in the family system.

How we got to this place can be traced over many decades and to various reasons. Though, when you find yourself in a ditch it is not as important how you got there as it is how you get out.

Many will not like my prescription because the places most look for help, the Government and pop culture cannot help. In fact, I would argue they are part of the problem. The remedy will not cost tax payers one red dime and does not require a new program from the Government or for Hollywood stars or famous singers of to give time or fortune toward. It is quite simple, really.

Here it is: we need to begin to take marriage and the raising of children seriously. You say come on preacher it can't be that simple, but yet it is. We as parents and couples need to take responsibility for the high office we hold. What office is that you may ask? Husband and wife and father and mother, these are the highest office anyone can hold, President, senator, congressman, doctor, esquire, pastor or any other position or office pales in comparison.

If people would just take their marriage vows seriously and the vows they take at Baptism for a child seriously and if children take affirmation of Baptism vows seriously many of the issues and ailments our society faces would shrink significantly. This requires personal responsibility from each of us. Our lives communities and nation rely on each other. Thus, when we have strong marriages and families we have strong children, schools, communities, and a nation. It is up to us to teach the next generation morals, ethics, common sense, manners and proper behavior as well as respect for the rights and life of everyone. Only, "We The People" can insure this to happen if we take marriage, family, children and especially God seriously.

Do you promise to fulfill these obligations? Brian do you also take these promises for yourself?

We will continue to collect school supplies during the next couple of months. The bins are out for collection, and feel free to take a sheet with the supply list. The list will be included in the bulletin each week, also. <u>NO</u> pencils are needed at this time. We have plenty left from last year!! Thank you again for your continued support..

Items needed for the School Kits:

- * 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper $8" \times 10 \frac{1}{2}"$ (<u>NO</u> loose-leaf paper)
- * 30 centimeter rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- * Pencil sharpeners
- * Blunt end scissors (<u>NO</u> pointed ends)
- * Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers (NOT NEEDED AT THIS TIME, THANK YOU)
- * Black or blue ballpoint pens (<u>NO</u> gel ink)
- * Boxes of 16 or 24 crayons (**ONLY** sizes)
- * $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch erasers

<u>NOTE</u>: LWR <u>cannot</u> accept any supplies other than those on the list. We ended last year with an abundance of pencils that will carry over to this year. We are usually mostly in need of the spiral notebooks, as <u>FOUR</u> of them go in each kit. Please make sure they are the 70-sheet, $8 \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ spiral notebooks. They are often sold for 15-25 cents during the back-to-school sales during July & August.

Last year we delivered 98 school kits for distribution! Hopefully, we can do as well this year. Thank you to First Lutheran for your support and generosity.
