The Gift of You

With Christmas bearing down upon us we will most certainly be thinking about the gifts we will receive. As an official cranky old man, I don't get any gifts and could care less about receiving any; my wife and I many years ago when finances when very tight made a decision to focus on our children when it came to Christmas giving. I guess at the present time we could rescind our previous decision, however, we still focus on our children and others and this brings us greater joy than any gift we could receive.

It is nice to receive a gift, but it is a greater blessing to give. Unfortunately, when it comes to Christmas giving our focus is generally on material goods and gifts. It appears that we have given more credence to the gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh than we do to the gift of Christ born unto us that night.

Certainly, Christ is the greatest gift ever given. However, when it comes to giving do we look beyond material things we can offer to the more often needed gifts God has bestowed upon us? Sometimes material things are needed; our food pantry and clothing closet here at the church has truly been a blessing to many. Though, seldom do we venture to see the greater gifts each of us has to offer.

Matthew 25: 14-30 (ESV) The Parable of the Talents

¹⁴ "For it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants^[c] and entrusted to them his property. ¹⁵ To one he gave five talents, ^[d] to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. ¹⁶ He who had received the five talents went at once and traded with them, and he made five talents more. ¹⁷ So also he who had the two talents made two talents more. ¹⁸ But he who had received the one talent went and dug in the ground and hid his master's money. ¹⁹ Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. ²⁰ And he who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me five talents; here, I have made five talents more.' ²¹ His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. ^[e] You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your

master.'22 And he also who had the two talents came forward, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me two talents; here, I have made two talents more.'23 His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.' 24 He also who had received the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed, 25 so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here, you have what is yours.' ²⁶ But his master answered him, 'You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I scattered no seed? ²⁷ Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was my own with interest. 28 So take the talent from him and give it to him who has the ten talents. ²⁹ For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance. But from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. ³⁰ And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

It goes without argument that Jesus is the greatest gift ever given. However, we often overlook the gift of ourselves. Why this is hubris you say! Pride comes before a fall! Yes, this is all true, but the gift of us is one we cannot overlook. God only made one of each of us and we all have a very special set of gifts God gave us to use for His purposes.

"The Parable of the Talents" is a reminder to us from Christ Himself of this very truth. We generally get all caught up in the guy who buries the talent. The focus, however, should be on the other two servants who doubled the master's money.

If we waste our lives and gifts then we are just like the wicked and evil servant. He did not use the gifts he had. They were each given the master's property according to their ability and this guy failed to use his ability. The other two lived up to their ability and used the gifts they had and were praised for their efforts.

At the end of the story the master takes the one talent from the wicked and slothful servant and gives it to the guy with ten. This goes against all our preconceived notions of fairness.

I hate to be the one to break it to you, but fairness is a concept that does not exist in reality. The parable itself makes this patently clear. They were given according to their abilities. Yes, some people have more God given ability than others. Some people are more attractive than others, better athletes, smarter, more driven and the list could go on into infinity. Every time I hear someone talking about fairness, I run the other way. The first rule of life is "Life ain't fair, get used to it." Besides who decides what is fair? What might be fair to me might not be fair to you. All we can do is use ourselves to the best of our ability.

I am certainly not the best pastor, preacher or theologian out there. Many are better speakers, more learned and especially better looking. However, this does not nullify the gifts and call God has placed on my life. I need to be the best pastor, husband, father, friend and person I can be according to my gifts. The same applies to each of you. Yes, Jesus Christ is the greatest gift ever; however, we are and have gifts that only we can bring to God's kingdom and the world.

May the gift of Christ shine on you this Christmas season and may the gift of you shine all year. Amen May the grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all

While we focus mostly on prayer shawls, we also provide mittens, hats, scarves in the winter, and baby blankets which are included in layettes that are given to new mothers in need in our community. Knitwits meets most Tuesdays from 9:30 to 11 am in the Munson room from fall through spring. All are welcome to join us, and while it helps if you have basic knitting and/or crocheting skills, we do our best to help beginners develop their skills.

Shawls: Shawls should be at least 60" long and about 24" wide. They need to be long enough to easily wrap around shoulders or be long enough to cover a person taking a nap. Triangle shaped shawls are pretty, but haven't been as useful to our recipients.

Baby blankets: should be at least 40" x 40"

Hats, mittens, & scarves: There is a bag in the knitwits cabinet labeled for the mitten tree. When the tree goes up in December, we will place those items on it.

Yarn has been donated to us and is available for anyone wishing to make items for our ministry.

Please wash all items before donating them. Thank you.

Anyone may request that a prayer shawl be given. There are guidelines for how to document them and how to wrap them posted inside our cabinet.

For the last two years First Lutheran Church has honored Jesse Ours with the Jesse's Ride for PTSD event. Although we are not having a Jesse's Ride event this year, that does not mean that we cannot honor Jesse, his service (& his sacrifice) by continuing our financial support of our local veterans and the Lutheran Military Veterans and Families Ministries, Inc. (LMVFM) in Fort Wayne, Indiana. The generosity of our First Lutheran family and sponsorships provided a majority of the profits of our Jesse's Ride events. To that effort, we are sponsoring a sale of RADA cutlery. This cutlery company is based in the USA and shares 40% of the profit from our orders with Jesse's Ride at First Lutheran. Their products are good quality and would provide nice Christmas gits.

We will then divide the funds received from the sales between the Livingston County Veterans office for gift cards (that are used for urgent veterans needs locally), and the LMVFM in Fort Wayne, Indiana - an NALC mission organization.


