Green Bay Packers legendary Head Coach Vince Lombardi is quoted to have said, "Perfection is not attainable, but if we chase perfection, we can catch excellence." His words ring true for all of humanity and especially Christians. Try as we may, we can never in this life be perfect. The only person to ever achieve this feat was our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Unfortunately, we are infected with the disease of sin. It is part of our fallen nature. So, does this mean we should stop trying and give way to every desire or thought that comes into our mind? The resounding answer without equivocation is NO!! However, you may say, if perfection is not attainable and we are infected with sin why try? It is not attainable here and now but one day it will be attained in us. At this present moment, as Luther describes, we wear our flesh around our necks. For the flesh is sinful by nature. But thanks to the merits of Christ and in Him alone, sin does not have to have a strangle-hold on us. 1 John 3:1-10English Standard Version (ESV)



but we know that when he appears^[a] we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is. ³ And everyone who thus hopes in him purifies himself as he is pure.

⁴ Everyone who makes a practice of sinning also practices lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. ⁵ You know that he appeared in order to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. ⁶ No one who abides in him keeps on sinning; no one who keeps on sinning has either seen him or known him. ⁷ Little children, let no one deceive you. Whoever practices righteousness is righteous, as he is righteous.⁸ Whoever makes a practice of sinning is of the devil, for the devil has been sinning from the beginning. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil. ⁹ No one born of God makes a practice of sinning, for God's^[D] seed abides in him, and he cannot keep on sinning because he has been born of God, and who are the children of the devil: whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is the one who does not love his brother.

February at Noah's Ark

We have 1 NEW student that we have added to our 4-year-old classroom, and also 2 NEW students to our 3-year-old class! We still have room for more students, in the 4-year-old PM class and 3-year-old MIDS so please tell your family and friends, we can add students any time during the school year!

The 3-year-old classes are held on Tuesday and Thursday from 8:15-10:15 and 10:30-12:30.

The 4-year-old classes are held on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:15-11:15 and 11:45-2:45.

The 3-year-old classroom has been doing some winter themed activities! They have been hard at work continuing to learn the letters of the alphabet and focusing on the letters specifically in their name. The class has also worked on counting objects and correlating the numbers to the amount of objects they have.

They have welcomed Miss Grove into their classroom and all are working on settling in to the new routine!

Our 4 year olds have been working hard on writing their names without using their nametags in preparation for Kindergarten! They have mastered much of the alphabet already! Since we are learning the alphabet in a developmentally appropriate way for their fine motor skills they are always eager to know what letter they are going to learn next J

We have worked with fun Winter/Snowflake activities for our small groups and learned about mixing colors to make new colors.

We have continued working on our Calendar binders, inside they trace the number for the day (which is our date), and they chart what our weather is outside that day! This helps them see data and which has more/less (sunny, cloudy, rainy, snowy or windy).

We have also been learning about our emotions with our emoji dice during circle time at the end of the day. This helps our friends learn that it is okay to share when they have big feelings and that it is OKAY to have lots of emotions. We should talk about them with adults if we need to and they can help us, or give hugs if they want one. So often children are told to "stop crying", or children's feelings aren't validated because it isn't convenient but we feel as though we need to communicate to children that "big" feelings are okay (as long as we are not act-ing out hitting and kicking) and teach them how to regulate these emotions correctly!

Our primary goal is still to ensure the safety of our students; parents and teachers while at the same time promote a **positive and fun** preschool experience J

KNITWITS UPDATE—WINTER/SPRING 2023

While we focus mostly on prayer shawls, we also provide mittens, hats, scarves in the winter, and baby blankets which are included in layettes that are given to new mothers in need in our community. Knitwits meets most Tuesdays from 9:30 to 11 am in the Munson room from fall through spring. All are welcome to join us, and while it helps if you have basic knitting and/or crocheting skills, we do our best to help beginners develop their skills.

Shawls: Shawls should be at least 60" long and about 24" wide. They need to be long enough to easily wrap around shoulders or be long enough to cover a person taking a nap. Triangle shaped shawls are pretty, but haven't been as useful to our recipients.

Baby blankets: should be at least 40" x 40"

Hats, mittens, & scarves: There is a bag in the knitwits cabinet labeled for the mitten tree. When the tree goes up in December, we will place those items on it.

Yarn has been donated to us and is available for anyone wishing to make items for our ministry.

Please wash all items before donating them. Thank you.

Anyone may request that a prayer shawl be given. There are guidelines for how to document them and how to wrap them posted inside our cabinet.

OUR TRIBUTE TO JESSE OURS

Our Fall 2022 mission project to honor Jesse Ours has come to an end. As of Nov 28, 2022, \$2645.41 has been donated either through our profit from the RADA cutlery purchased or through direct donations given through the church. What an amazing and extremely generous amount of giving by everyone. Our First Lutheran Church family is a group of very giving people living our mission. As of the last Mission Social meeting on 11/28, \$1000 worth of gift cards were purchased and donated to our Livingston County Veteran's office to be used for veteran's needs in our county. In January when all the donations from December are received the donation to the Veteran's and Families Ministries of Fort Wayne, Indiana, our second designated organization for this year will be sent out. Our Jesse's Ride funds are in a designated account within our FLC accounting system and are not affected by our new church accounting year. Our account with the RADA cutlery company also stays active year- round, and any profit from purchases made using the First Lutheran Church Code will be received and will be designated for Jesse's Ride and distributed to a veteran's group.

In addition to the money given to these two above listed organizations, the Mission Social committee this year, as part of our annual budget, donated funds to the sustaining care of the support dog at Pontiac Jr High.
