Well another year has passed and a new one has arrived. As we look back at the past and forward to the future the question arises what now? What can we as God's people do to fulfill the mission Jesus gave us?

Matthew 28:16-20English Standard Version (ESV)

The Great Commission

¹⁶ Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. ¹⁷ And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in^[a] the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Have a meeting of the minds about the mission of the church and you will get multiple answers depending on who you ask. Some want to focus on growth, some on teaching some on the so-called purpose of their specific ministry. However, Jesus put all this foolishness to rest if we focus on His words toward us.

First of all the power is His and His alone. No one nor any group has the power to exempt themselves or the universal church from the purpose and mission of Christ. You can have any program, type of service or theological teaching you want but if it does not further the mission Christ laid out it is just a preverbal waist of time and energy. If it is not fulfilling the mission of Christ then one must ask whose mission is being fulfilled?

The mission is Christ's that is obvious. Now what is the the mission? "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations!" And what prey tell is a disciple. Simply put it is a follower of Jesus Christ. Yes a follower of Jesus not a follower of a minister or of some theological musing but of Jesus Christ Himself and His teachings. I for one love books and commentaries, however, as much light and knowledge as they may pass on to us they are not the teachings of Christ. Only scripture can enlighten us on these teachings. A great place to start is the "Beatitudes" and continuing through "The Sermon On The Mount." In my humble opinion this text is the heart of Christian Discipleship.

We also get all caught up in what is God's will and plan for me? That is all fine and dandy to seek out but Jesus simply says GO. If we just do that perhaps our questions regarding God's will and plans can take care of themselves. Abram was told to go to a place God would show him later; I dare say if it worked for the Patriarch it can be effective in our lives as well. I have come to learn, if we just do what is needed or follow a passion Christ has put in us God will move and grow our efforts beyond our imaginations. The hard part is not finding something to do or somewhere to go but is taking the first step of faith and beginning the journey.

As this new year of 2023 begins let us renew our resolve to follow Christ and His mission and we will be fast on our way to fulfilling "The Great Commission."

KNITWITS UPDATE—WINTER 2022

While we focus mostly on prayer shawls, we also provide mittens, hats, scarves in the winter, and baby blankets which are included in layettes that are given to new mothers in need in our community. Knitwits meets most Tuesdays from 9:30 to 11 am in the Munson room from fall through spring. All are welcome to join us, and while it helps if you have basic knitting and/or crocheting skills, we do our best to help beginners develop their skills.

Shawls: Shawls should be at least 60" long and about 24" wide. They need to be long enough to easily wrap around shoulders or be long enough to cover a person taking a nap. Triangle shaped shawls are pretty, but haven't been as useful to our recipients.

Baby blankets: should be at least 40" x 40"

Hats, mittens, & scarves: There is a bag in the knitwits cabinet labeled for the mitten tree. When the tree goes up in December, we will place those items on it.

Yarn has been donated to us and is available for anyone wishing to make items for our ministry.

Please wash all items before donating them. Thank you.

Anyone may request that a prayer shawl be given. There are guidelines for how to document them and how to wrap them posted inside our cabinet.

OUR TRIBUTE TO JESSE OURS

Our Fall 2022 mission project to honor Jesse Ours has come to an end. As of Nov 28, 2022, \$2645.41 has been donated either through our profit from the RADA cutlery purchased or through direct donations given through the church. What an amazing and extremely generous amount of giving by everyone. Our First Lutheran Church family is a group of very giving people living our mission. As of the last Mission Social meeting on 11/28, \$1000 worth of gift cards were purchased and donated to our Livingston County Veteran's office to be used for veteran's needs in our county. In January when all the donations from December are received the donation to the Veteran's and Families Ministries of Fort Wayne, Indiana, our second designated organization for this year will be sent out. Our Jesse's Ride funds are in a designated account within our FLC accounting system and are not affected by our new church accounting year. Our account with the RADA cutlery company also stays active year- round, and any profit from purchases made using the First Lutheran Church Code will be received and will be designated for Jesse's Ride and distributed to a veteran's group.

In addition to the money given to these two above listed organizations, the Mission Social committee this year, as part of our annual budget, donated funds to the sustaining care of the support dog at Pontiac Jr High.
