Ecclesiastes 3:17–22

¹⁷I said in my heart, God will judge the righteous and the wicked, for he has appointed a time for every matter, and for every work. ¹⁸I said in my heart with regard to human beings that God is testing them to show that they are but animals. ¹⁹For the fate of humans and the fate of animals is the same; as one dies, so dies the other. They all have the same breath, and humans have no advantage over the animals; for all is vanity. ²⁰All go to one place; all are from the dust, and all turn to dust again. ²¹Who knows whether the human spirit goes upward and the spirit of animals goes downward to the earth? ²²So I saw that there is nothing better than that all should enjoy their work, for that is their lot; who can bring them to see what will be after them?

*Qoheleth is the Hebrew name of the writer of Ecclesiastes many believe King Solomon is this writer.

Here are some thoughts on Ecclesiastes 3: 17-22

Thesis

We fail to enjoy our present life and what we have, because we strive for more things and a future, which is not, guaranteed us.

"Don't let living stop you from living"

When I grew up in West Virginia, I couldn't wait to leave the mountains behind and go to a place where the grass was greener on the other side. If I would ever see another mountain again it would be too soon. Some of the most breathtaking scenery in the world was right in front of me, but I could not see the preverbal forest for the trees. Just like many people today, I did not appreciate what was already given me, to enjoy. I desired to have bigger and better, but what I failed to realize is that we are not guaranteed anything beyond what we have right now. We cannot even count on tomorrow for it may never come for us. You see, God has given us today and we should embrace every moment as though it may be our last, because sometimes we let living keep us from living.

I. A time for every experience (17). Different experiences come and go in our lives. lf l've learned anything we all will have our ups and downs. I've made good money and I've been broke. I have had extreme highs in life and lows. My life is not much different than many of the people we read about in scripture. Job had his moment of blessing and his great time of tragedy. He was blessed with a large family and many possessions only to have all taken away in a moment. So did Qoheleth. He had striven for greatness, wisdom, and riches and found that his striving was all in vain. Because, fame can come and go, just ask a once famous celebrity, whom few remember anymore. Wisdom and money can also be fleeting as those of you who were given advice as to where to invest your money can attest. All our striving, many times, leads us to invest time and effort, just like Qoheleth, into things that in the end are not that important.

II. *The only guarantee is death*. (18-21). Death, is a pretty morbid subject, but it is the one certainty in life. No one gets a pass when it comes to death. Animals die and people die; as morbid as it may sound it is inevitable. Nothing is guaranteed to us, not even tomorrow. It sounds clichéd but it is true, time is our most precious commodity and I know I have wasted my fair share by worrying about future events that may never come and are not promised. I have failed many times to enjoy my time at work and with my family and friends. Time is limited and should be used wisely



and enjoyed because tomorrow is not guaranteed, but death is.

III. *Enjoy your possessions* (22). Each of us, no matter our lot in life has been given certain possessions. Possessions are not just the things you have, but family, friends, and life. According to Qoheleth, it is our potion to enjoy what we have. The family we have should be a focal point in our lives. Enjoy your family, for I am sure many of you are like me and would desire to have more time with loved ones who are gone. How many times do we take for granted the friends in our lives and fail to give them the love and support they need. We also take for granted our own life, many times we dread each day of work or of time spent with family and friends because of some minor hang-up on our part that we allow to interfere with our relationships. How often do we give all our time and initiative to getting some possession or a better job at the expense of our relationships? I can raise my hand as one who is guilty, what about you?

Conclusion. Let us now turn over a new leaf, to enjoy the present. Maybe we can each do a selfinventory and find what areas of our lives we have neglected. For we each have so many things in our life to enjoy here and now. Hopefully, each of us can find ways to enjoy the life we have now. For nothing is guaranteed to us except today. Let's all not let living keep us from living.




