Peace

I must admit - I have grown weary of our vitriolic, divided and hateful society. Each day we, as a culture, appear to devolve even further into the abyss of disharmony, disunion, and dysfunction. I used to think it would settle down and folks would come to terms with our differences, in thought and life. However, with each passing day, we trod inch by inch away from civility, togetherness, and love for one another. This is certainly a sad commentary on our society.

Though one could focus this frustration on the secular world, I will not; for the world is acting just as it should. One can expect nothing more from the world in general. My frustration is tuned into a group that should know better and are expected to act in restraint and peace - Christians!! Yes, the beloved body of Christ, those who have been made new creatures in Jesus Christ. However, many times, I can see little difference from those who claim to be in Christ and therefore new creatures and the aforementioned secular world.

Many think when Paul wrote to Timothy and divulged the following list of offences that he was discussing the secular world. Those who assume this could not be further from the truth, he was discussing the future state of Christians and it would appear we have not disappointed.

2 Timothy 3:1-5 English Standard Version (ESV)

Godlessness in the Last Days

3 But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. ² For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³ heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-

control, brutal, not loving good, ⁴ treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, ⁵ having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people.

Not a very good list at all. And remember he is talking to Christians here and primarily to pastors and teachers. These acts and the aforementioned vitriol, dividedness and hatefulness are a far cry from who Jesus calls us to be. As his disciples, we are called to rise above the way of society and seek his ways. Instead of seeking to divide each other on petty political and cultural means we should be the ones leading the charge for unity and peace. Matthew 5: 9 English Standard Version (ESV) ⁹ "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons^[a] of God."

Here is what Dietrich Bonhoeffer offered on this particular Beatitude:

Jesus' followers are called to peace. When Jesus called them, they found their peace. Jesus is their peace. Now they are not only to have peace, but they are to make peace. To do this they renounce violence and strife. Those things never help the cause of Christ. Christ's kingdom is a realm of peace, and those in Christ's community greet each other with a greeting of peace. Jesus' disciples maintain peace by choosing to suffer instead of causing others to suffer. They preserve community when others destroy it. They renounce self-assertion and are silent in the face of hatred and injustice. That is how they overcome evil with good. That is, they are makers of divine peace in a world of hatred and war. But their peace will never be greater than when they encounter evil people in peace and are willing to suffer from them. Peacemakers will bear the cross with their Lord, for peace was made at the cross. Because they are drawn into Christ's work of peace and called to the work of the Son of God, they themselves will be called children of God.

We are not called to a political party or to a country in reality, nor to a political policy, but to Christ. I love this country and its people, however, my first and foremost allegiance is to Christ. My actions cannot be those of the world but of Christ. He called us to be "peacemakers." We seem to have thrown off this mantle for the mantle of discord. It is time for us as Christians, as those who claim Christ as Lord and Savior, to become the disciples he called us to be.

Many blessings from our most relevant Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!
