Stewardship as Purpose

Stewardship: the position and duties of a steward, a person who acts as the surrogate of another or others, especially by managing property, financial affairs, an estate, etc.

the responsible overseeing and protection of something considered worth caring for and preserving:

Steward: a person who manages another's property or financial affairs; one who administers anything as the agent of another or others.

We often hear the word stewardship and turn our focus on to the financial aspect of the term. Stewardship certainly does center on our tithes and offerings. All of our earthly possessions in reality belong to God. He is just gracious to lend us these things during our lifetime and expects us to use them in a proper way for his kingdom and glory. Last month we discussed this aspect of stewardship with "Change Stewardship."

This month we move our gaze to our time, talents and life as pertains to stewardship. In each and every church community God has placed the gifts needed for that particular body of Christ to implement the mission he has given that specific congregation. In essence, the gifts needed here at First Lutheran are in each of you. Yes, you have gifts; given to you by God to do his will in this church and community.

Many folks just want to leave the work of God's kingdom to others. However, we are all called to participate in the mission of the church. Only you can as Paul reminds young Timothy in 2 Timothy 1: 6 "stir up the gift of God, which is in thee." Sometimes we must extract the gifts of God within us. It is not easy or convenient to do the work of the kingdom but it is necessary. Once we have begun to mature in Christ we move from being recipients of the churches mission to being participants. This is part of worship and worship is an active practice for each and every Christian. Young and old alike have a role to play in this mission.

If we all take our work for God' kingdom to heart we can easily fulfill First Lutherans role in the greater work of the whole church. I ask each of you to find your place and stir up your gift for God today. If we all do this, the necessary work of FLC will continue and no one person or group will be overloaded in the process. We have much to be done here at First Lutheran; and I encourage YOU to consider the gifts you have and how you can use them for the work of God here in the church and our community.

What makes for a good steward? Throughout Scripture we are given many examples of what it means to be a good steward of God's gifts. Here are just a few verses from the Bible that describe the way this happens:

SHARING ... see Mark 10:17-22 God's people have always seen the need to share what they have with others. As much as we have a need to receive, we all have a need to give as well.

TEAMWORK ... see Acts 2:44-47 Just as it was in the early church, we have to work together in using our resources, in order for the message of Jesus to be spread among all people.

ENTHUSIASM ... see Matthew 13:44-45 Jesus spoke of the joy we receive in recognizing the treasure of God in our life. This joy allows us to see our money and possessions in a different light.

WITNESS ... see 2 Corinthians 8:1-7 Stewardship is the way we live out our Christian lives. By the sharing of our resources, we bear witness to our faith and trust in God.

ACCEPTANCE ... see Luke 16:13 Being a good steward demonstrates our acceptance of God's lordship in our lives. As Jesus said, we cannot serve both God and money.

RESPONSE ... see Deuteronomy 26:1-11 The reason we give is because we ourselves have first received all things from God. Sharing what we have is our response to what God has done for us.

DETERMINATION ... see 1 Corinthians 16:1-2 Being a good steward requires fore-thought and commitment. It is a personal discipline carried out with regularity on a week-by-week basis.

Mission/Social Committee Project: LWR School Kits

We will continue to collect school supplies during the next couple of months. The bins are out for collection, and feel free to take a sheet with the supply list. The list will be included in the bulletin each week, also. <u>NO</u> pencils are needed at this time. We have plenty left from last year!! Thank you again for your continued support..

Items needed for the School Kits:

- * 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper 8" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (<u>NO</u> loose-leaf paper)
- * 30 centimeter rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- * Pencil sharpeners
- * Blunt end scissors (<u>NO</u> pointed ends)
- * Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers (NOT NEEDED AT THIS TIME, THANK YOU)
- * Black or blue ballpoint pens (<u>NO</u> gel ink)
- * Boxes of 16 or 24 crayons (**ONLY** sizes)
- * $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch erasers

<u>NOTE</u>: LWR <u>cannot</u> accept any supplies other than those on the list. We ended last year with an abundance of pencils that will carry over to this year. We are usually mostly in need of the spiral notebooks, as <u>FOUR</u> of them go in each kit. Please make sure they are the 70-sheet, $8 \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ spiral notebooks. They are often sold for 15-25 cents during the back-to-school sales during July & August.

Last year we delivered 98 school kits for distribution! Hopefully, we can do as well this year. Thank you to First Lutheran for your support and generosity.
